



Utility Rebates: How Much Can You Save?

Depending on your utility providers, you will be eligible for a different group of rebates as shown in the chart below. Federal tax credits are calculated on pre-rebate amounts. **NOTE:** All rebates listed in this document are subject to change and new rebates are frequently added. Be sure to check the utility websites listed at the end of this document for the most up-to-date information.

Group A – Seattle City Light:

- \$95 home energy audit with direct installs

Group B – Puget Sound Energy gas customers, any electricity provider:

Heating systems

- ENERGY STAR qualified boiler (95 percent AFUE): \$350
- ENERGY STAR qualified forced-air furnace: \$250
- Fireplace: \$200

Water heating systems

- ENERGY STAR qualified tankless: \$150-\$200
- ENERGY STAR qualified storage: \$50

Group C - Puget Sound Energy electric and/or gas customers:

Insulation

- Floor insulation: 50 percent of the cost, up to \$400
- Attic insulation: 50 percent of the cost, up to \$400
- Wall insulation: 50 percent of the cost, up to \$400
- Duct insulation: 50 percent of the cost, up to \$200
- Duct sealing: 50 percent of the cost, up to \$200

Windows

- Window upgrade: Up to \$500, per fully insulated home

New homes

- ENERGY STAR qualified manufactured home: \$150 - \$300

Group D - Puget Sound Energy electric customers, any or no other gas provider:

Heating systems

- Ductless heat pump (1.0 ton minimum): \$800
- ENERGY STAR qualified geothermal heat pump: \$1,500
- Forced-air furnace to air-source heat pump conversion: \$1,000
- Air-source heat pump: \$200 - \$350
- Heat pump sizing and lock-out control: \$200
- Heat pump air handler/furnace fan motor upgrade: \$250

Water heating systems

- ENERGY STAR® qualified heat pump water heater: \$250
- Storage (.94 Energy Factor or higher): \$50
- Waste-water heat recovery system: \$250

Appliances

- Clothes washer: \$50-\$100
- Pick-up and recycling of old refrigerators: Free+\$30

Lighting (instant in-store discount)

- Compact fluorescent light (CFL) bulbs: Up to \$3
- CFL fixtures: Up to \$12

Converting to natural gas

- Home and water heating: \$1,950 - \$3,950
- Home heating only: \$500 - \$2,500
- Water heating only: \$950

Energy-use evaluation

- HomePrint™ home performance evaluation: Up to \$350

Group E - Snohomish County PUD, Electrically heated homes:

• Attic insulation	• 50% of job cost up to \$1,200
• Floor insulation	• 50% of job cost up to \$1,800
• Wall insulation	• 50% of job cost up to \$1,000
• Duct sealing & insulation	• 50% of job cost up to \$400
• Glass metal frame to double-pane vinyl	• \$3.00 / sq. ft. up to \$1,000
• Thermostats:	
○ Licensed electrician installer	• 100% of job cost up to \$50
○ Owner installed	• 100% of job cost up to \$25
• Heat pumps, ductless	• 50% of job cost up to \$800
• Heat pumps, ducted – air source	• 50% of job cost up to \$1,200
• Heat pumps - geothermal	• 50% of job cost up to \$2,000
• Heat pumps - geothermal with dedicated hot water line	• 50% of job cost up to \$2,500

Group F – Cascade Natural Gas

Energy-Saving Measure	Basic Specifications	Incentive
Floor Insulation*	Equal to or greater than R-30 or to fill cavity [†] , prior condition must not exceed R-11	\$0.45 per sq. ft.
Wall Insulation*	Equal to or greater than R-11, prior to condition must not exceed R-4	\$0.40 per sq. ft.
Ceiling or Attic Insulation*	Equal to or greater than R-38, prior condition must not exceed R-18	\$0.25 per sq. ft.
High-Efficiency Natural Gas Furnace*	90% AFUE, or greater	\$150
PTCS Duct Sealing*	Ducts must be sealed to PTCS standards	\$150
High-Efficiency Natural Gas Furnace + PTCS Duct Sealing*	90% AFUE, or greater Ducts must be sealed to PTCS standards	\$400
High-Efficiency Natural Gas Hearth	80% AFUE, or greater	\$70
High-Efficiency Combination Radiant Heating System with Tankless Delivery**	90% AFUE, or greater	\$800
Conventional Natural Gas Water Heater**	.62 EF, or greater	\$25

- Water heaters, furnaces, boilers, heat pumps, central air conditioners, building insulation, windows, doors, roofs, circulating fans used in a qualifying furnace
- Biomass, stoves that use qualified biomass fuel
- 30% of the value. Aggregate amount of credit for all technologies placed in service in 2009 and 2010 combined is limited to \$1,500
